

NECTAR PLANTS FOR MOTHS

Not all moths drink nectar, but those that do are likely to visit the same flowers you plant for butterflies. However, a good range of night-scented flowers will also help lure them in during the evening.

These include:

Honeysuckle, *Lonicera periclymenum* (right)

Common Jasmine, *Jasminum officinale*

Evening Primrose, *Oenothera*

biennis Sweet Rocket, *Hesperis matronalis*

Night-scented Stock, *Matthiola bicornis*

Tobacco Plant, *Nicotiana alata* (or

Nicotiana glauca which has tubular flowers

that are too long for most British moths to reach the nectar, except for the immigrant *Convolvulus* Hawk-moth.)
